- : Operates Monday Friday. We have 2 kindergarten groups Red group and Blue Group. Blue group attends Mondays and Tuesdays 8.15am 3.15pm. Red group attends on Thursdays and Fridays 8.15am 3.15pm. Each group also can access 5 full day catchups on specified Wednesdays during terms 1, 2 and 3.
- Bilingual Support : Support is available for children from language backgrounds other than English through the Preschool Bilingual Support programme.

Site Global budget. Negotiated Education Plans, where required, are established in collaboration with parents, centre staff, the DECD Special Educator & other relevant agencies.

General characteristics: Roxby Downs is an "industrial suburb / mining town" positioned in an isolated country location. It is not a rural town. The community is characterised by its youth, high disposable income and job opportunities.

Many families come from overseas, interstate and locally, with many in the early years from the Eyre Peninsula. The opal mining town of Andamooka is 35 kms away.

Children come from a variety of backgrounds – Industrial (mining), Agricultural (farming), city (urban) and city (industrial), resulting in a varied population with some transiency. There are a group of residents who call Roxby Downs home and many more who stay from months to a few years. The challenges presented by the transience in this community are largely overcome by the relative youth and resilience of the population, having to establish themselves in a new community without extended families and acquaintances. The community is young and vibrant.

2. Key Centre Policies

Implementing our Quality Improvement Plan (QIP)

The centre is currently exceeding the national quality standard in all seven areas. Areas identified for continued improvement during 20187 include:

- Improving educator knowledge of the Preschool Indicators of Literacy and Numeracy and a greater STEM focus
- Improving communication about the educational program with families
- Revising our Statement of Philosophy to reflect views and beliefs of new staff, families and children
- Ongoing professional development and critical reflection to identify areas for improvement and articulate learning to others
- Intentional planning for explicit learning through routines, small and large group experiences
- Support families with knowledge and skills to promote oral language at home

Belonging within a family, community and culture

Being 3, 4 or 5 years old

Becoming a confident learner and contributor to Australian society.

Core Values

: Kindergarten is a safe place for children to learn about themselves, others and the world, and where learning can be fun, meaningful, exciting and engaging.

Specific curriculum approaches

- : Play based pedagogy is used where children learn through meaningful opportunities to play and engage with high quality materials, skilled educators, and other children.
